

Certificate in Electrical Engineering

Start Date: February and July 2016 **Location:** Porirua **Level:** 3

Learn a wide range of practical skills and knowledge across the electrical industry. Discover best practice for use of hand tools, power tools and test instruments. Complete practical projects in a workshop environment. Be well prepared to start work as apprentice electricians or in a related trade.

Certificate in Automotive Engineering (Advanced)

Start Date: February and July 2016 **Location:** Porirua **Level:** 3

Gain a range of NZQA Motor Industry Level 3 and 4 unit standards which will help in gaining an apprenticeship as an automotive mechanical or electrical engineer.

Certificate in Carpentry

Start Date: February and July 2016 **Location:** Porirua **Level:** 3

Learn a mix of theory and practical skills needed to enter an apprenticeship in the construction industry. You'll learn to construct floor and wall framing, fix roofing, cladding and internal linings, fit windows and hang doors. Develop hand tool and power tool skills, safe work practices and increase your knowledge of building codes, construction standards and regulations.

Certificate in Beauty and Hairdressing

Location: Porirua and Kāpiti **Level:** 3

Learn about make-up, cosmetics, beauty products and hairdressing. Gain essential theory and practical experience during salon days and other promotional events; practice on real customers. This programme includes the National Certificate in Hairdressing (Salon Support) (Level 3).

Certificate in Carpentry

Start Date: February and July 2016 **Location:** Petone **Level:** 3

Learn a mix of theory and practical skills to enhance your employment options. On WelTec's building site or on a marae, you'll learn to construct floor and wall framing, fix roofing, cladding and internal linings, fit windows and hang doors. Develop hand tool and power tool skills, safe work practices and increase your knowledge of building codes, construction standards and regulations.

Certificate in Foundation Studies (Painting)

Start Date: February and July 2016 **Location:** Porirua **Level:** 3

The Certificate in Foundation Studies (Level 3) programme, specialising in painting, will give you all the key skills needed to begin work as an assistant to a painter within the construction industry. With experience and further study you can progress to a qualified tradesperson in a team or become self-employed. Other building industry jobs, such as plastering or tiling, are also an option.

This certificate provides students with knowledge of how to interpret drawings and specifications for building work. Students will learn safe worksite practice in preparation, through to finishing off a paint system in a practical tertiary education setting.

Certificate in Electrical Engineering

Start Date: February 2016

Location: Petone **Level:** 3

Designed for those wanting to pursue a career as an electrician, appliance service technician, electrical fitter or electronics serviceperson, this programme will provide you with broad based training in all aspects of the industry and includes a large practical component with at least eight hours of work experience per week.

Certificate in Brick and Block Laying

Start Date: February 2016

Location: Petone **Level:** 3

Designed for those wanting to learn skills and enter careers in the brick laying, block laying, tiling or paving industries. You will learn how to interpret plans, consult with clients and work on a range of practical projects.

- > Learn the techniques and skills of block laying, bricklaying and tiling
- > Use and maintain hand-tools
- > Install drainage systems
- > Learn workplace health and safety and first aid
- > Develop skills in hard surface construction (concrete, paving, slate and tiling)

Certificate in Applied Decorating Skills

Start Date: July 2016

Location: Petone **Level:** 4

An introduction to the decorating industry. You will gain skills in hanging wallpaper and friezes, specialised and vinyl wall coverings, spray coating and decorative colour effects and glazing. A work experience component is designed to reinforce learning and skills developed in the programme.

Location: Petone **Level:** 3
